Will lead to almost all independent contractors being reclassified as covered employees, including for workers' comp. Firefighter Safety	<u>5175</u>	Requires L&I to adopt a rule governing firefighter exposure to carcinogens, and directs \$100,000 to be allocated to purchase protective equipment for firefighters in jurisdictions with limited resources.	Monitoring	Heard in Senate 1/22; set for committee vote 02/04
Off-duty conduct protections	<u>5226</u>	Makes it a violation of the Washington Law Against Discrimination to take adverse action	Evaluating	Set for public hearing 02/07
